Yuni's Thrift

Yuni's Thrift is a delightful store where you never know what treasure you might find. Located at 2822 N. Broadway, the shop is run by Eunice Gonzalez and her daughter Deanna.

Their business began as a hobby in 2019, and when the pandemic began, the buying and selling of unique products was a way to earn income. They sold many items on Facebook Market place, and opened a shop last year across the street from the current location.



"We moved to our current location in January of 2022," explains Deanna Gonzalez, which provides more space; the shop is shared with Allison's Flower Shop, which uses the rear portion of the store space.

"We specialize in antiques and unique treasures," says daughter Deanna, who also participates in purchasing products for the store. Eunice and Deanna go to estate sales and other sales to find unique items to sell at Yuni's Thrift. How do they know if something will sell?

"Sometimes we see something and we just have a feeling," says Deanna. About a quarter of the store space is clothing, such as lots of dresses, but



there are many other treasures too. As you look around the shop, you see beautiful furniture, art pieces, lamps, kitchenware, and jewelry. And they particularly enjoy obtaining unique marble items.

They still sell certain items on Facebook Market Place. You can also follow them on Instagram at Yunis.thrift.

The majority of the customers from Yuni's Thrift are from the local community, near and around Lincoln Heights, though some come from further afield. They see lots of repeat customers who know that Eunice restocks her store with new materials every two weeks. "People love to come and search around for little treasures," says Deanna with a smile.

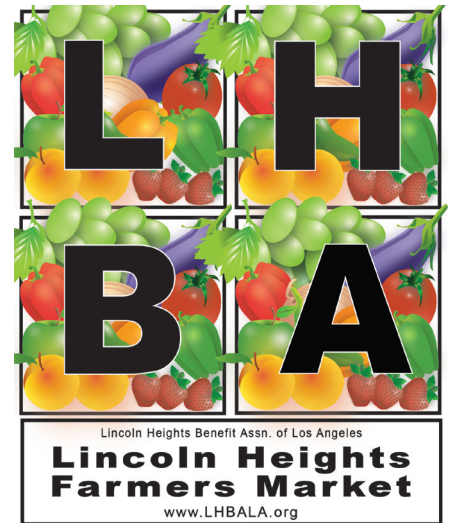
