You're in for a great surprise when you walk into Pete's Pet Supply at 2828 N. Broadway in Lincoln Heights. Yes, it says "Grooming Service" in big letters when you enter, but the shop is really a full service pet and feed supply store.

There are cages of all sizes and any animal products you might need for your pets. I was surprised to see several iguanas in the store, one of which is a pet of the owner. Willy the iguana is not for sale! Willy is Cortes' pet.

There are guniea pigs and water turtles for sale, as well as many birds and fish. There are snakes and reptiles! The store is a wonderful place to browse and to get an education from





the owner Javier Cortes.

The biggest part of their business is dog grooming; the special deal is \$50 for small to medium dogs. Most people drop off their dogs (or cats) and come back in a short while to get the groomed dog. They also provide an animal boarding service. They have many repeat customers who enjoy the service they receive. They provide bathing, ear cleaning, nail trimming, anogland, and even pet sitting.

They also sell a full line of animal feed, which you can weigh out yourself.

The atmosphere is wonderful, and you can pause and look at the many animals. According to Cortes, the koi are the most popular fish in the store and the parakeets are the most popular bird.

The pet store has been in the Lincoln Heights community for the past 30 years, so it's a business that's a pillar of the community which you can trust. They have been at the present location for 10 years, and before that, they were just next door. When you visit, though there is some parking on Broadway, they have parking in the rear for your convenience.


